



**If you answered “Yes” to 2 or more of the symptoms listed in question 1, or to having fever/chills, coughing or barking cough, shortness of breath, decrease or loss of taste or smell**

- Child/staff should stay home and isolate immediately
- Contact health care provider for further advice or assessment, including if the child/staff needs a COVID test or other treatment.
- Check with PHU to determine if other members of the household, regardless of symptoms, should isolate and for how many days.
- Contact the school/childcare about the results of the screen.

**If you answered “Yes” to only 1 of the sore throat/difficulty swallowing, runny/stuffy/congested nose, headache, nausea, vomiting/diarrhea, extreme tiredness/muscle aches do not go to school/childcare.**

- Child/staff should stay home for 24 hours from when the symptom started.
- If the child/staff symptoms resolve within the 24-hour observation period and can pass the daily screen, they may return to childcare/work. (Negative COVID test not required)
- If symptom persists or worsens, contact a health care provider for further advice or assessment including if the child/staff needs a COVID test or other treatment.

**If you answered “Yes” to question 2 or 3**

- Child/staff should stay home and isolate immediately for 14 days
- Contact health care provider for further advice or assessment, including if the child/staff needs a COVID test or other treatment.
- In symptoms develop, contact Public Health for further direction.

**If you answered “Yes” to question 4, or 5**

- Child/staff should stay home and isolate immediately and follow the advice of Public Health
- If you answered “yes” to question 4, visit an assessment centre and get tested for COVID-19 and take further direction from Public Health
- If child/staff develops symptoms, they should contact local public health unit or the health care provider for further advice.



**If you answered “No” to all questions, the child may attend school/childcare. Follow the established protocols of the school or childcare to notify of these results.**

\*Kids & Us recognizes that the provincial tool indicates travel outside of Canada, however Kids & Us is taking increased measures to keep the children, families and staff safe. Therefore, Kids & Us has decided that any travel outside of Ontario by children, families or staff under the Provincial Lockdown will require a 14-day isolation period prior to returning to the child care in any capacity.
